

# Christian symbol

VICTOR'S CROSS — Also called the conqueror's cross, the victor's cross is composed of the Greek cross, recognized by its four equal arms, adorned with Greek letters in each quadrant. The top left

letters stand for Jesus and the top right letters stand for Christ (the horizontal lines above them indicate that they are abbreviations). The four letters across the bottom spell the Greek word for conqueror.

Counseling provides the opportunity to process emotions related to life events and other stressors. We validate a person's emotions and assist them in creating healthy coping skills and self-regulating techniques.

### **Counseling Services Includes:**

#### Individuals:

anxiety, depression, trauma, grief and loss, relationships

#### Couples/Families:

communication, infertility, grief and loss, conflict resolution skills, Pre-Marital Counseling

#### Children/ Adolescents:

adoption, foster care, trauma, play therapy, social skills, bullying, divorce, relationship skills, executive functioning skills, anxiety, depression, ADHD, grief and loss

#### Support Groups:

adoptee support group, grief and loss, major life changes, social skill building, teen support groups

#### Referrals

PCHAS receives referrals for individual, family and group therapy from local professionals as well as other agencies, schools and mental health facilities. PCHAS provides counseling services to its clients in a nonthreatening manner as part of our effort to strengthen families and keep them together.

PCHAS therapists do not offer psychiatric services such as medication management but work with local providers to ensure a smooth continuum of care. If a client's needs cannot be met by The Counseling Center, a referral will be made to an agency or provider better equipped to accommodate the presenting needs or concerns.

#### Fees

Funding for counseling is accepted from several private insurances and self pay. If electing self-pay, PCHAS accepts several forms of payment, including checks, money orders, debit cards and major credit cards.





We hope to set up a Mission Sunday soon and update


membership on some of the local organizations we support. Review letters, etc., on our bulletin board in the Narthex.

# Superimposed love

Maybe you've heard how salvation is like a total solar eclipse: God doesn't see our sins because Jesus' holiness covers them completely. Or maybe you've heard how trials can cause an "eclipse of faith."

At WorldChallenge.org, Pastor Gary Wilkerson explains that in Greek, eclipse means "I am absent" or "I cease to exist," because people once thought the gods temporarily extinguished the sun. "For Christians, a 'spiritual eclipse' is a dark hour when God seems to be absent from our lives," Wilkerson writes.

Wilkerson points to Peter being sifted like wheat, Elijah and Jeremiah facing extreme discouragement, and David collapsing morally. Amid Satan's attacks, "God seems completely absent," writes the pastor. "In that dark moment of eclipse, the devil has created such chaos we can't possibly see a way out." During times of testing, Christians must cry out to God and trust his faithfulness.

Completing the eclipse analogy, Wilkerson shares Titus 3:4, the "love of God our Savior appeared" (NIV). The Greek meaning of appeared here is superimposed, he writes. God looks on our fraught-filled times of eclipse and "superimposes his divine love over us."


In May we will combine lessons eight and nine. We will also be taking up the Birthday Offering.
